NEWS FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

Dear Parents,

In this week's assemblies, we explored the importance of Black History Month - why we celebrate it and what it means. The children learned about Mary Seacole, a pioneering black nurse from the Crimean War who, despite being rejected by the government when she offered to help, refused to give up. She funded her own journey and worked tirelessly to care for soldiers on the battlefield - a true example of courage, resilience and compassion, and a wonderful example of our school motto, 'Perseverantia Vincit.' I also shared a favourite quote from Maya Angelou: "People will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel." I left the children with thoughts of standing up for fairness, celebrating everyone's talents, taking pride in who they are, and always showing respect for others.

On Tuesday, a group of 23 Prep musicians from Years 4 to 6 attended a Strings Day at Dean Close School, where they spent the day rehearsing and preparing for a concert performance. Guided and inspired by members of the Carducci Quartet, our young musicians rose to the challenge of sight-reading several new pieces and rehearsing intensively in their instrumental sections. The day concluded with a super concert — a wonderful experience and a memorable opportunity for all our players to make music together.

Also on Tuesday, our Prep School 'Book Look' took place – and it was wonderful to welcome so many parents. The classrooms were filled with smiles as the children proudly shared their work from the term. It was a fantastic opportunity for families to celebrate progress and see the effort and enthusiasm that go into every page of their books.

On Thursday, our Year I pupils arrived at school dressed as superheroes, ready for a day of fun and adventure! They took part in exciting rescue challenges, designed capes and masks, created superhero vehicles, and even attended a 'Superhero Academy' featuring an obstacle course and other physical challenges. The day concluded with a brilliant parade and some fun games. Huge thanks to the Year I team for imagining and organising such a fabulous day!

NEWS FROM RECEPTION

In Reception we have continued our topic about ourselves by naming and labelling parts of our bodies and exploring our senses. The children enjoyed becoming scientists and conducting an experiment to see if they could identify different store cupboard ingredients using their sense of smell; they quickly identified mint, ginger and hot chocolate powder.

In maths this week we have been exploring pattern. We began the week by identifying different types of patterns that we found within the classroom; the children were great pattern detectives and found spotty, stripy and flowery patterns. We continued our learning by copying, continuing and creating our own repeating patterns using natural materials and loose parts. Our art this week combined maths with autumn as the children printed using harvest fruit and vegetables to create repeating patterns; the children have truly become experts in spotting and making AB patterns this week.

Literacy has focussed on using the sounds we have learnt so far in phonics this term to help us begin to write captions. The children have used their 'robot arms' to segment words into their individual sounds and then, using their sound mats, finding the letter that matches the sound. We are so proud of how well all the children are doing with their phonics

progress over the few weeks has been amazing; thank you too for all the support you are giving your child at home with reading and recognition of sounds.

We are looking forward to seeing you at Parents' Evening on Monday; it is always a great opportunity to share your child's progress with you. Please remember our door is always open if you have any questions or concerns.



SAFEGUARDING UPDATE

We want to make you aware of a recent safeguarding issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the Spy Dogs, Spy Cats, and Spy Pups series.

Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries, and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.



- If your child has any Spy Dog, Spy Cat or Spy Pups books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site.
- It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves the concern is only with the outdated link.
- We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.
