NEWS FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

Dear Parents

Mr Cross and I were delighted to attend the Junior Schools' Art Exhibition at Malvern St James on Saturday morning. The annual event is a wonderful showcase of children's art from many schools across Gloucestershire and neighbouring counties, and we have submitted work - and done very well - for many years. This year we were thrilled that two of our pupils achieved Highly Commended certificates; congratulations to Harriet C-W, (5B), and Maddie LG, (2S). A huge well done to all our talented exhibiting artists; it was so good to celebrate your creativity. We can all look forward to our own Summer Art Exhibition, which will take place in the Summer Term. This after-school celebration of art will showcase at least one piece of artwork from every pupil in the school; further details to follow soon.

In Monday's Pre-Prep and Reception assembly, I reminded the children about Rainforest Concern's visit to school a couple of weeks ago. I asked the children what they remembered about Helen's assembly, and was pleased with the facts they recalled including those about rainforest animals - particularly sloths - tropical plants such as aloe vera, and fruits including avocados. I taught the children the meaning of the word 'deforestation', and why we have chosen Rainforest Concern as one of this year's school charities. Remaining on the theme of the western world's demand for tropical produce - and using bananas as an example - I went on to explain the challenging conditions that banana pickers work in, and told the children why choosing to buy fair trade products is ethical. The children particularly enjoyed filing in and out of assembly to the traditional Jamaican folk song, of 'Day-O (The Banana Boat Song)!'

You may have read in last week's newsletter that the Berky Gets Greener eco-committee is encouraging pupils to take part in the Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel event. This is the UK's largest inter-school cycling, walking, wheeling and cycling challenge, and is taking place this week and next. Its aim is to reduce congestion and air pollution on the school run - and to simultaneously increase children's physical activity. The eco committee had already taken a tally of the pupils' methods of transport to school before the event started, and they are hoping that the tally taken after the two weeks will show a trend towards car-free school runs triggered by the Sustrans event. Well done to everyone who is taking part in the challenge.

Well done to our Year 6 wildlife experts, who competed this week in the first round of the Gloucestershire Primary Schools' Wildlife Quiz. They beat Swindon Village and Christ Church primary schools, and are one of six teams though to the semi-finals. On Thursday, our quizzers - who had reached the semi-finals - tested their general knowledge to compete for a place in Quiz Club's primary schools' national finals. Although we didn't qualify, we came 16th out of 51 teams! Well done to you all!

With the Spring Concerts on Wednesday, next week promises to be tremendously busy, so enjoy a restful break this weekend.

NEWS FROM PRE-PREP

Wow, after their successful trips last week, what a brilliantly busy week Year I and 2 have had.

Last week, Year I went out of this world during an incredible trip to Oxford Science Centre. To support our term's learning, the children went inside a planetarium and were blasted into space, where they visited the moon and several planets of our Solar System. The children were fascinated exploring the planet Mars, star constellations and stunning galaxies. At the centre, the children also got to spend time in the 'Exploration Zone'; where a range of hands on, science-based activities inspired and enthused the children; they created giant marble runs, explored magnets, looked at changing temperatures, created circuits, made rockets that flew up into the sky from the air table and learnt to use microscopes. Who knows, maybe the skills learnt could help one of them to become an astronaut in the future!

Over the last couple of weeks, our budding Year I authors have enthusiastically written their second book. This time they have developed their own information books, finding lots of facts based on planets. What a fun couple of weeks it has been in Maths. Year I have been doing lots of weighing and measuring and have really enjoyed using scales: comparing objects to see which is heavier and which is lighter. This week rehearsals started for our Year I assembly. Lots of children have already learnt their lines - well done. We really appreciate all the help parents have given to help them.

Meanwhile, Year 2 have been excitedly etching and printing; they have been using safe print polystyrene and ink. First of all, they deconstructed a castle, spotting patterns and shapes within their castle pictures. After that, they etched them onto polystyrene - all under the expert guidance of Mrs Bareham. In CWB they have looked at staying safe and lots of fun has been experienced in science looking at habitats. Year 2 have also been developing their ability to measure mass and capacity; lots of practical activities have been experienced and they have worked well. Spurred on by World Book Day, last week, the year group have been inspired to do lots of reading in our beautiful library. We are looking forward to filling the Pre-Prep library with some new books, thanks to the fabulous support of everyone who came to the book fair. C M-L
