#### Dear Parents

We had a very successful Open Morning on Saturday with a significant number of visitors. Without exception they praised our super Year 5 and 6 tour guides for their enthusiasm - they did a marvellous job and thank you for allowing us to have them in school! Our catering team put on a tempting spread of homemade bakes, and I am also grateful to all the teaching staff for their imaginative displays of the children's work all over the school, and for all the staff who gave up their Saturday mornings to be here in School.

On Wednesday, we were pleased to welcome Reception and Year I parents to a presentation by Mrs Meredith-Smyth, (Acting Head of Early Years and Reception teacher), on our new Essential Letters and Sounds phonics scheme. We are delighted with the progress our children are making with their reading and writing, and it was enlightening for us all to witness the animated way in which Essential Letters and Sounds are taught here at Berkhampstead. He delivered a very animated and interactive presentation to our Year 3 children about his latest book 'Escape Room', which involved the children excitedly working through some of the challenges in the book. Year I children also enjoyed a brilliant extra-curricular activity this week with a trip to The Wild Place; our young explorers took part in an exciting African Safari workshop. And all the children in the school benefitted from the PTA's 'Cake at Break' on Tuesday - thank you to the parents from Reception and Year 4 who were responsible for the delicious, autumn-themed bakes.

We are pleased to announce a measure that we are introducing after half term to help keep our children even safer online. Although the internet is an integral and important part of our lives, there are some risks, and it is vital that teachers, parents and pupils all work together to ensure its safe use. We educate our children about e-safety issues, teaching them the appropriate behaviours to enable them to remain safe when using the internet, and in addition to this - as well as internet network filters - we will be working with SchoolsMobile, a digital safeguarding platform, to ensure that our children are further protected online and given an age appropriate digital experience. SchoolsMobile has developed an app that will be added to your children's school devices, and these will be installed on all 1:1 iPads (Year 4-6) that are managed by school but go home with the children. As school are purchasing a licence for each child in Years 4 to 6, parents of these pupils will then be able to use SchoolsMobile on non-school devices - free of charge - if they wish. We will be hosting an information session for parents, with staff from SchoolsMobile, on Thursday 16th November at 8.30am and 4pm in the Andrews Centre gym.

I am looking forward to our final event for this half term - Harvest Festival, at All Saints' - this afternoon. The Prep children have been practising their readings and I have enjoyed hearing VoxBox rehearsing 'Streets of London,' and Early Years and Pre-Prep children practising 'Nsawe', a rhythmical African harvest song. It should be a lovely event; donations will be sent to the Thomas Franks Foundation who provide essential food provisions and healthy meals to food banks and families struggling with food poverty.
