It was super to see so many Pre-Prep parents and grandparents at Tuesday's 'Book Look.' Our Year I and 2 children proudly showed off their work - it really was a lovely occasion; thank you to everyone who attended the event.

I would like to take the opportunity to acknowledge our Year 6 cohort, which over the last few months, has been taking the grammar school test and entrance exams to senior independent school. It is important to us that every child goes to the senior school that is best for them, whether it is a state academy, grammar school or independent school, and we prepare them accordingly. Out of a year group of 31 children, so far our Year 6 leavers have been awarded 15 scholarships - including academic, drama, music and sports - and 79% of the year who took the test have been offered grammar school places. We pride ourselves on our excellent results, but recognise that these are only a part of the depth and breadth of what pupils achieve here, and I am proud of each and every one of our Year 6 pupils. Our aim is to enthuse children with a love of learning and the desire to make the very most of their abilities, interests and opportunities. Well done to you all.

Thank you to our two student teachers, Miss Jolliiffe - who has been in Reception - and Miss Marsh who has spent the term in Year 1. Both have been brilliant, and I wish them the very best of luck for the future.

Our Easter Service at All Saints' Church takes place on Tuesday. It is so important for us to gather as a community, and I shall enjoy seeing the younger children lead the service.

All that remains is for me to wish you all a very happy and restful Easter break. After a term packed with so many events, there are many tired - but happy - individuals around the place - staff and children alike. NEWS FROM KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten has been a frenzy of all things Easter this week; we have made Easter crafts, making repeating patterns using Easter eggs, hiding pom poms in plastic eggs to develop our fine motor skills, and learning about floating and sinking using toy eggs in the water tray. We have been counting eggs using Numicon to help. Numicon is a multi-sensory way of learning about and understanding numbers, holes in the Numicon represent numbers to 10, when arranged in order children can easily make connections between numbers.

The chicks have grown so much, we have loved watching them change and develop. They are now ready to move on to their new homes, and we have secured homes with Berkhampstead families. There was great excitement throughout the week as during our Circle Time the chicks

have been allowed to roam free. The children sat

so patiently waiting for the chicks to come near to them and then there was so much laughter when the chicks moved, pecked the floor, and flapped their wings.

In our story telling area the children have been playing 'teachers'; all the adults have loved listening to the children pretending to be one of us.
