Dear Parents

On Monday, we were delighted to welcome artist Teresa Paiva to the Prep School, to work with our Year 6 children and Head of Art, Mrs Hartley. Teresa delivered a superb workshop in which our oldest year group worked collaboratively to create four striking Olympic-themed wall hangings, learning the techniques of fabric painting, block and sponge printing along the way. The day was a huge success, and the completed wall hangings will be showcased at our Summer Art Exhibition on Wednesday 19th June; I, for one, can't wait to see the finished artworks on display. The day marked the beginning of a very exciting week for Year 6: on Wednesday, they headed off for their three-day residential at Viney Hill. (More about this later).

Despite the iffy weather this week, thankfully it was perfect for the whole school photograph on Tuesday. I was most impressed with the cheerful organisational skills from NextGen Photography and the co-operation from the pupils - getting 260 children - aged 3 - II - and more than 60 members of staff to pose smartly is no mean feat; head to Instagram to see the time-lapse footage and behind-the-scenes pictures. The photograph should be ready to order soon after half term.

On Wednesday, Head of Music, Mrs Mitchell held an exciting Music Taster Afternoon for Years 2 to 4 - and many parents - who watched our team of wonderful music teachers demonstrating their instruments. We were also impressed by Atlas M (5K), Angus C (5K), Starlar H (4P), Ioan C (4P) and Ollie S (3C) who performed their instruments so beautifully. Following the concert and talks, pupils went to try out the instruments. We like to give the children an opportunity to try a wide variety of instruments and for them to choose for themselves. The most important thing is that children are ready to take on the lessons and weekly practice - and we have beginners in all Prep years at Berky. Thank you to all our music teachers; we look forward to new musicians starting in September.

This week we have also celebrated 'National Bee Day'. We have found out some amazing facts about bees such as only female bees can sting! We have come to realise just how important they are to life on earth as we learnt about pollination. The children then used oil pastels to create beautiful pictures of our stripy friends and some made posters encouraging people to look after

In maths we have explored shape, including properties of 2D and 3D shapes and spatial relations. We have looked at orientation and talked about how our brains can play tricks on us when looking at shapes at different angles. The children have enjoyed challenging their brains to visualise shapes in different orientations and selecting shapes for purpose within their play.

In literacy this week we have been composing a class story about a hungry Indominus Rex hunting in a forest. We were blown away with the children's creativity and imaginative ideas — although the story concluded with a rather gory ending for a pterodacty!

The children have been set to work over half term to make sure they are secure with all of their phonics sounds and harder to read and spell words and we are so looking forward to our topic next term -
