Year 6's Detective Project Workshop on Wednesday proved to be another fantastic and enriching learning experience for our pupils. Our oldest children enjoyed a morning of playing detective and participating in exciting hands-on forensics

investigation. The children explored the science of finger printing and chromatography, all the time developing science skills already picked up in their lessons, and learning how science is used in real life situations. To end the morning, the pupils were presented with a crime scene and had to explain what happened by investigating a variety of clues on a body such as a mobile phone, invitation to a party and jelly baby in the mouth. Judging by Mr Morphew's reports of the day, I am quite sure the visit has inspired a bunch of future detectives!

NEWS FROM KINDERGARTEN

Our trip to Crickley Hill was amazing! It started with the children's excitement of travelling on the school's minibuses. On arrival, we sat on logs at base camp, and our group leader for the day, Claire read a story about minibeasts having a party. The children then went off to explore the enclosed woodland. The activities included an investigation of materials and a minibeast hunt; the children looked under logs and tree stumps to find a variety of creatures and collected moss, sticks, bark, and leaves which were all transported to a large tray for the minibeasts to have their party. The children could also create their own music for the party through rustling leaves or tapping sticks.

In Kindergarten this week we have been listening to different versions of the story 'The Three Little Pigs'.

We have set up a variety of activities for the children; they have been problem solving and team building through building houses with straw, sticks and bricks and showing great imagination when acting out the story with props, books, and pictures, plus creating some super collages of the wolf and the pigs. Our maths focus this week has been capacity, the children have using words such as full and empty when pouring tea for the Three Little Pigs. MM

NEWS FROM RECEPTION



The Reception children are fully embracing their new topic of 'Alive or Extinct?' wowing us with their knowledge of dinosaurs (and challenging the teachers with the spelling and pronunciation of many of them!). As part of our art, we have been creating junk model sculptures of dinosaurs, including a collaborative class piece using mixed media. James Mayhew's lovely story 'Katie and the Dinosaurs' has been our focus text this week with the children imagining what it would be like to step from a museum into a prehistoric land!

Our Understanding of the World sessions have focused on the inspirational life of Mary Anning and the children have loved sharing their own experiences of fossil hunting. Next week we will be creating fact files about Mary and continuing to find out the ground-breaking discoveries she made on Lyme Regis Beach as a young adult.

In mathematics, we have explored number patterns, playing lots of games and looking at numbers to 20 and beyond. The children impressed us with their reasoning and ability to spot patterns. In phonics we have continued to look at past tense suffixes to root words while consolidating our previously learnt sounds and harder to read and spell words. Z M-S & JG
