#### Dear Parents

NEWS FROM KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten have experienced bear frenzy this week. On Monday, we acted out the story of 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen; the children thought of different actions they could use for the swishy, swashy grass and a swirling whirling snowstorm. There were many elements from the story to play with in the room too such as a bear hiding in a cave and a sensory tray that contained snow, twigs, grass, and mud.

On Tuesday, some children went to Forest School. We went on an adventure to find bears that were hiding amongst the logs and hedges. Once we found them, all the children continued with their exploring and investigating. Miss Wootton organised for the other children to participate in a sensory experience, giving thought to what they could, see, hear, and feel, and the children walked through sticks and leaves, snow, mud, grass, and water.

On Wednesday, the children brought in their bears, and we enjoyed a teddy bears' picnic with Mrs Bareham, Mr Cross, and Mrs Meredith-Smyth. I loved learning all the bear names - some were quite unusual. Everyone was brilliant at squeezing and spreading sticky honey on to a slice of bread and then choosing what shape they would like their sandwich to be; this linked to our maths focus for the week of learning the names of 2D shapes.

On Thursday, we played percussion instruments and learned a song about a brown bear sleeping and snoring throughout winter. The children decided the bear's snoring would be loud and chose to play, claves and drums, whilst others decided the snow and ice melting would be quiet and chose to play tambourines, bells, and maracas.

Next week we would like children to bring in some autumn treasures, such as different coloured leaves, conkers, acorns, and sticks, for the next part of our topic.
