Dear Parents

I was delighted to welcome one of our parents, Mrs Howard to school this week, to talk to the children about a brand new Berky initiative. Our School Council, Eco Committees, those taking part in the Platinum Award - and many individual pupils - already carry out plenty of good work, but Mrs Howard and her team - with the school's support - are on a mission for the Berkhampstead community to do even more. She told the children all about her idea for a social action group, and implored the children to become 'Change Makers' in order to make the world a better place. Good deeds may be environment-themed, for instance, or raising money for charity. She has challenged the children to come up with a name for the social action committee, and is planning a special pupil-led assembly each term. Much to the delight of the children, there will be an afternoon dedicated to social action activities (the children's ideas) and starting from this term, there will be a food waste competition to determine which school house wastes the least amount of food over the course of a week. Her overriding message was that everyone has the power to act with the utmost kindness and empathy, to make the world a better place, and that anyone can be a change maker.

Fittingly, during this same assembly, I congratulated Year 6 pupils, George J, Zack P, Wilf M and Josiah R for taking part in the Eastnor Mud Bath at the weekend. George was fundraising for Football For Humanity and has raised a whopping £645 so far. I was also incredibly impressed that out of 538 runners, Wilf and George, a couple of our finest athletes, came I 3th and I 4th in this mainly adult 6km race! Well done, too, to Year 4's Hermione H and Anna H who organised a fun charity run for Great Ormond Street Hospital and have raised an incredible £844, and are still counting. The kind-hearted duo, who have impressive PR and marketing skills, invited David Moorcroft, (former middle and long-distance runner - and former world record holder for 5,000m), to start the run. These altruistic tendencies bode well for the success of Mrs Howard's initiative.
