Dear Parents,

The theme of Children's Mental Health Week this year is 'My Voice Matters'. In my assembly on Monday, I stressed how all of our children have the right to express their views, thoughts and feelings, and how important it is that they are listened to, and have their views taken seriously. This year's theme resonates with us here at Berkhampstead. Our pupils are actively encouraged to express their opinions, and our pupil-led School Council and Eco committees - who represent the views of their peers - meet regularly to share ideas, and discuss issues that matter to them. Activities and Circle Times inspired by this year's theme have been taking place all over the school. Kindergarten children, for instance, took turns hugging Andrew Bear, and telling their friends about a person or place that is special to them, Year I discussed things that make them feel happy and relaxed, and other year groups - with a view to boost their feelings of self-worth - completed worksheets highlighting what they felt proud of. In my own Citizenship and Wellbeing lessons, we have been looking at how we can use our voice and what is special and unique about each one of us.
